# Three Truths about Salvation

Mark 7: This chapter includes 3 encounters of Jesus which reveal 3 truths about Salvation:

### I. THE PLIGHT OF MAN: HELPLESSNESS

- A. The Accusers: the religious elite (v.3) Pharisees, Scribes, Elders
- B. Christ' Condemnation: 4 realities of Human Depravity

Their Habits (Tradition): (v.5) the tradition of the elders,

Their Hypocrisy: 'This people honors Me with their lips, But their heart is far from Me.

Their Heresy: (v.7) Teaching as doctrines the commandments of men.'

Their Heart: (v. 21) "For from within, out of the heart of men, proceed evil thoughts...,

### II. THE PLACE OF FAITH: HOPEFULNESS

- A. The seaker: v. 26 The woman was a Greek, a Syro-Phoenician
- B. The Faith: Humble Worship v.25 she came and fell at His feet.

The Faith: Bold Confidence v. 28 "Yes, Lord, yet even the little dogs under the table eat from the children's crumbs."

C. The blessing: answered prayer v.29 "For this saying go your way; the demon has gone out of your daughter."

### III. THE PASSION OF CHRIST: LIMITLESSNESS

- A. The sufferer: (v.32) they brought to Him one who was deaf and had an impediment in his speech,
- B. The surpassing power of Christ's passion: (v.34-35) (Jesus) said to him, "Ephphatha," that is, "Be opened." Immediately his ears were opened... his tongue was loosed,
- C. The stunning impact of Christ's passion: (v.37) And they were astonished beyond measure, saying, "He has done all things well.

This chapter includes 3 encounters of Jesus which reveal 3 truths about Christ' nature: He is all knowing, He is all merciful, He is all powerful

## CONCLUSION: Salvation is all about Jesus Christ

There is no substitute: (Ac 4:12) "Nor is there salvation in any other, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved."

There is no self-effort: (Eph 2:9) not of works, lest anyone should boast.
